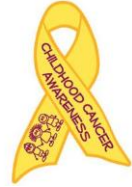




'Draw for Mae' Campaign



"I want to be a fireman when I grow up"

"When I am older I want to be an astronaut and fly to the moon and back!"

At World Child Cancer we believe every child no matter where they live in the world should be able to fulfil their ambitions and dreams.

We are asking your school to take part in our 'Draw for Mae' fundraising campaign in honour of a little girl called Mae, who is currently receiving cancer treatment at Yangon Children's Hospital, Myanmar. Mae dreams of a future free of cancer, and one day becoming a ballerina. Unfortunately the likelihood of Mae fulfilling her dream is very uncertain, with survival rates for childhood cancer in the developing world as low as 10%, in stark contrast to 80% survival rates in the developed world.

World Child Cancer believes this inequality should not exist.



How to get involved?

We are asking students to join Mae in sharing a drawing of what they want to be when they grow up.

These drawings can then be displayed on an exhibition day and entered in a competition. The parents will need to buy a pack of 5 tickets (£1 donation per ticket) and with their child/children vote for their favourite artworks. The top three winning drawings from each class can then be displayed for the rest of the year on a 'Wall of Dreams'.

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
